14-WEEK BOOK OF MORMON CHALLENGE

History of this "Summer" Book of Mormon Study Challenge: In an attempt to help the vouth in his ward become acquainted with the scriptures and the great power of the Lord's word contained in the Book of Mormon, and to help them not "take a vacation" from their scripture studies they were getting in seminary during the school year, on Monday, May 26, 2003 (Memorial Day), Bishop Richard J. Clark of the Valencia Ward of the Tucson Arizona East Stake started his youth on a schedule to read about 5 ½ pages a day and complete reading the entire Book of Mormon 98 days later, on Labor Day. He gave of his own resources to prepare a great barbeque for those youth (and their leaders) who completed it-and he is an excellent cook, so it was worth it just for the barbeque alone! The challenge was issued to the youth and other ward members every year while he was bishop, and in 2007 he and his counselors, James Gubler and Quintus Schulzke, explored setting up a program that the whole ward could participate better inone based on the family's needs and goals. Reading the entire Book of Mormon was a very good goal for those who had never done so, but it was not a challenge that primary children could as easily fulfill, and the act of reading front to back in and of itself did not go deep enough for those who had already read it through and needed time for pondering the Lord's teachings therein.
