

14-WEEK BOOK OF MORMON CHALLENGE

14-Topic Personal Study Challenge of 30 Minutes a Day

This personal study challenge goes out to youth especially, but can just as easily be used by adults & parents. We hope that you will bring to greater light the selected 14 topics in your own lives.

1. Set aside 30 minutes each day for personal scripture study—the goal is not quantity of pages, but quantity of time (search, ponder, and pray); track of your progress here
2. Begin and end your individual study with sincere prayer
3. Make *True to the Faith* (TF) reading a part of your study—notice that it's written to you
4. Make the seminary *Scripture Mastery* (SM) taken from the Book of Mormon and the Old Testament* a part of your study—even try to memorize some, if not all of them
5. Ask yourselves those searching questions suggested each week or others you come up with as you ponder and pray
6. As part of the 30 minutes, write your inspired thoughts and personal revelation from the Holy Ghost into your personal journal
7. There is no requirement to stick to the suggested scriptures or resources, nor should you avoid searching out your own answers through other cross-references. Let the Holy Spirit guide you!

Keys to Success

If you are including or focusing on *Scripture Mastery* (SM) selections individually or with your family, help yourself and family members learn the background and context, and you may even want to memorize some of the scriptures together (Study Cards with background/context can be viewed or ordered at <http://seminary.lds.org/>, see the *Scripture Mastery* link). Encourage family members to keep a personal journal to record thoughts and personal revelations. The key success out of this challenge will be to establish habits of daily study in your personal lives and as families. They say 30 days makes a habit! Try it. Do it. The rewards will be great!

Stick to the Basics

Elder Bednar delivered a talk in 2007 in which he covered the various aspects of scripture study through reading (Mosiah 1:5), studying (D&C 26:1), searching (John 5:39; Alma 17:2), and fasting (2 Nephi 32:2). Keep in mind these words from him as you consider your approach to studying the scriptures: **“You and I do not need sophisticated study aids and should not rely extensively upon the scriptural knowledge of others. We simply need to have a sincere desire to learn, the companionship of the Holy Ghost, the Holy Scriptures, and an active and inquiring mind.”** (“A Reservoir of Living Water”, Elder David A. Bednar, Feb. 4, 2007.)

Elder Bednar also mentions that a good first step (if you haven't already done so) is to read the Book of Mormon from beginning to end. Some of our new members, and Deacons or Beehives may wish to make that their first challenge. An evenly paced schedule is another 14-week challenge laid out for you. May we all “press forward with a steadfastness in Christ” (2 Ne. 31:20).

* At the time of creation of this program the Old Testament was the course of study for the coming year in seminary. More Scripture Mastery selections will get added later.

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Week 1 – A sincere desire to learn

Do I have a motivation in my life to read the scriptures? If yes, what is it, and is it enough that I'm willing to replace other pleasures and pastimes—including TV & video games—with scripture study? If I don't have a motivation, what is my ultimate destination in life? Who do I love most in my life? What kind of person do I want to marry? Will I have children to influence? Do I have close friends? Is blessing any one of these lives today or into the future enough to motivate me to study the scriptures today?

Week 2 – Develop a closer relationship with Heavenly Father and Jesus Christ

John 17:3 reads “And this is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent.”; and John 7:17 reads “If any man will do his will, he shall know of the doctrine, whether it be of God or whether I speak of myself.” Am I doing the Lord's will to get to know Him better or am I trying in some other way? How well do I know Him? Will I rejoice to see the Savior and Heavenly Father some day because I am like them? What will it take to maintain or get His image to be reflected in my actions, being, and countenance?

Week 3 – Exercise the Gift of the Holy Ghost and obtain personal revelation

I have the gift of the Holy Ghost, but am I exercising it daily, and is my ability to listen and do as it tells me? For what kinds of decisions do I need the guidance of the Holy Ghost? How does the Lord expect me to use the Holy Ghost to stay close to Him? Am I really entitled to personal revelation? What revelations have I received lately?

Week 4 – What has God promised to me if I'm faithful?

Are there promises God has made to me that I can find in the scriptures? How much do these promises mean to me? Do I really believe the Lord will do as he promises? What do I have to do to obtain the promises given? Is it a hard choice for me? Do I really want what the Lord has promised me?

Week 5 – “For we know that deliverance is nigh” (*We Thank Thee, O God, for a Prophet*)

The Book of Mormon is full of deliverance episodes from earthly captors; who are my captors? Have I been delivered from them in the past, even by my own ancestors? What's the spiritual parallel I can take from my ancestor's experiences or the experiences recorded in the Book of Mormon? Do I need deliverance now? Is there any deliverances to come that I will even witness?

What does it mean to have a love of all men? Can I be saved without it? Why should my own salvation have to be tied up with others'? Where am I lacking in a love for all? Does it hurt me to ignore this command? How would my life change if I practiced such love?

Do I repent of the all the sins I commit, and of all the things I fail to do (sins of omission)? Can I reach a point where it's too late to repent? Is it possible that Heavenly Father loves me less because of the sins I've committed? Do I really believe in the healing power of the atonement when I repent?

the truth?

before I came to earth? Are my choices today the same? Are they different? Is it easier or
harder? Have I applied the Atonement in my own life? Do I feel my Savior's love every day?
